When is Pay It Forward Funding available?

Pay It Forward Funding applications will be available April 9, 2021 via the ASA Newsletter. Applications are due May 7, 2021.

Pay It Forward Funding is available to Minnesota State faculty and staff who wish to replicate a previously funded innovation and bring it to their campus.



How many innovation projects will be awarded?

Educational Innovations hopes to fund 4 - 6 of the proposals being pitched.



Who decides the proposals that are funded?

Funding will be determined by the panelists in association with the Minnesota State system office.



When will the funding decisions be made?

The decisions will be announced no later than April 23, 2021 via the ASA Newsletter.
